

# Why rangelands and pastoralists, and why now?

Rangelands cover 54% of the world's land surface and sustain the livelihoods of 1.2 billion people and up to 500 million pastoralists. They support 60% of global food production, store a third of Earth's terrestrial carbon, and deliver up to 70% of livestock feed.

In Africa alone, pastoral systems support over 100 million livelihoods and contribute nearly 40% of agricultural GDP. These landscapes are also home to a rich diversity of flora and fauna, and host community, private, and public nature conservancies, which are critical sources of revenue through tourism.

But despite their immense value, rangelands and pastoralist systems remain undervalued, underfunded, and misunderstood. Half of the world's rangelands are at risk of degradation due to the climate crisis, conflict, land fragmentation, misguided policies, and underinvestment.

All too often, pastoralism is seen as a barrier to development rather than a model of resilience and prosperity. We cannot build a just, prosperous, and sustainable world without rangelands and pastoralists.

The United Nations has declared 2026 the International Year of Rangelands and Pastoralists (IYRP) – and the time is now to put these often-forgotten landscapes and communities on the map.

### What is GLF Africa Rangelands about?

Building on the Global Landscapes Forum's decade-long legacy of driving sustainable landscapes, the event will connect over 5,000 participants across Africa and the world, bringing together voices from the landscapes, including pastoralist leaders, policymakers, investors, researchers, innovators, the private sector, Indigenous Peoples, local communities, women, and youth.

Through high-level plenaries, interactive sessions, policy dialogues, investment roundtables, innovation exhibitions,

knowledge sharing, cultural showcases, and global media outreach, the conference will:

- Elevate the agency of rangelands and pastoralism in climate, biodiversity and food system discourses.
- Showcase science-driven solutions, cutting-edge Al and disruptive tech, local innovations and traditional knowledge.
- Advocate for policy and investment commitments to restore degraded rangelands.
- Strengthen alliances and lay the ground for resilient rangeland and pastoralist livelihoods, economies and ecosystems.

- Climate resilience and bridging the Rio Conventions in rangelands: Lessons for thriving under uncertainty
- Restoring rangeland health: Tackling land degradation and biodiversity loss
- Land, water and governance: Securing rights, reducing conflict and fostering cooperation
- Nature economy and livelihoods: Unlocking value chains, financing community-led conservation, (eco)tourism and payment for ecosystem services (PES)
- Science, technology and Indigenous knowledge: Harnessing AI, biotech and traditional wisdom

- A knowledge synthesis report with evidence and solutions for scaling.

Ahead of GLF Africa: Rangelands 2026, the GLF Africa Community & Action Assembly will bring together youth, grassroots leaders, and GLFx networks from across Africa to spotlight rangelands as vital ecological and cultural systems. The week-long gathering will provide space for reflection, learning, visioning, and solidarity, featuring a field visit to local rangeland communities, dialogues, storytelling, and an Africa Landscape Dialogue that bridges traditional and scientific knowledge. The Assembly will amplify local voices and co-create strategies to position rangelands and pastoralist communities at the heart of Africa's development agenda.
