

STATEMENT BY

MR. MENDSAIKHAN ZAGDJAV MINISTER OF FOOD, AGRICULTURE AND LIGHT INDUSTRY MONGOLIA

at 42nd Session of FAO Conference on 14–18 June 2021

Distinguished representatives, Dear Ladies and Gentlemen,

First of all, I would like to congratulate all of you participating in the 42nd Session of FAO, and express my deepest appreciation to the FAO team for hosting this important conference virtually at this difficult time when every country is struggling with the pandemic.

All countries are working hard to overcome the pandemic with minimal damage on their economy, and to recover the post-pandemic economy in an environment-friendly manner and to fulfill its obligations to the international community.

Mongolia is a country with harsh climatic conditions and a long history and rich culture in livestock husbandry, and we are also taking step-by-step measures to overcome the pandemic with minimal impact and to shift the economic recovery from the pandemic to a greener environment. It will also help pastoralists to increase their cultural system and traditional pride, especially among young generations, and play a significant role in sustainability, poverty reduction, and sustainable development in developed and developing countries.

The Government of Mongolia has begun to develop an action plan for the implementation of this initiative in cooperation with relevant international organizations, and as the initiating country, a certain amount of financial support and funding will be approved in the budget law of Mongolia for the implementation.

We are confident that 'The International Year of Rangelands and Pastoralists' will have a real result and positive impact on increasing the world's food supply, reducing hunger and poverty, and providing the world's population with high-quality and ecofriendly food by the sustainable use of pastureland.
